

Reversible Rambling Cabled Scarf

Designed by Nancy Skorupa
(aka: The Noble Knitter)

Inspired by "Rambling", a Susan B. Anderson design for the Spud & Chloë line. I love cables, but on a scarf, I prefer to not have a wrong side to the scarf. You see, my scarves always flip over, so I always try to make them reversible. This is a great first project for people who want to learn how to cable, as there is not chart or wordy instructions to interpret. Enjoy!

MATERIALS:

2 hanks Spud & Chloë Sweater
(160 yards per hank)

US 9 needle

Cable needle - optional

GAUGE: Not critical

FINISHED SIZE: Approx 6" wide by 72" long

ABBREVIATIONS:

K: knit

P: purl

SL: slip stitch purl-wise

C8B: place 4 stitches on a cable needle and hold to the back, knit the next 4 stitches on the left needle, knit the 4 stitches held on the cable needle.

INSTRUCTIONS:

Cast on 34 sts.

Row 1: sl 1, K2, *(K1, P1) 4 times, K2, repeat from * twice more, K1

Work cable as desired. You can stagger the cable across the 3 columns as you choose. You should cable with at least 4 rows in between the cable (ie, cable on row 5, then 9, then 13, etc).

Continuing working row 1 including cables, to desired length and bind off.
